Why recycle?

It protects the environment by saving natural resources and reducing carbon emissions. At less than half the cost of sending waste to landfill, it saves money too.



Can I leave large waste items on the pavement or around the bins?


Not without arranging a special collection. Otherwise it's fly-tipping. That's a criminal offence and if found guilty, you can face a fine of up to £50,000.

Please do not place bags of waste or large waste items on the bin lids, in or around the bin store areas. This can prevent collections from taking place.

RULES FOR VANS

If you plan to use a van to drop off items at the Reuse and Recycling Centre please ensure that you have booked this in advance using your MySouthwark account. Failure to do so will result in you not being able to use the Centre. Use of vans is now limited to four visits per year.


Where can I take my household waste?

Open all year round except Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's day.
